Lookout Communications Escape Routes Safety Zones

SYNOPSIS

On August 8, 2014, at approximately 1830 hours, multiple firefighting personnel were overrun by a flaming fire front on Branch IV, in the area of the Division P/W break, while providing fire suppression efforts on the Lodge Complex in central Mendocino County.

NARRATIVE

Multiple firefighting resources were assigned to a firing operation in Division P near the Division P/W break. After a safety briefing was given, safety zones established, crews began a firing operation. At approximately 1815 hours additional resources sent from Leggett Staging arrived into the area to support the firing operation. The main fire intensity and picked up dramatically during that time as it transitioned from a ground fire to a fast running canopy fire.

At approximately 1825 hours, Lodge Air Attack made notifications to ground resources a fast moving crown fire was going to impact the ridge where multiple white engines were parked. Crews in the area experienced a sudden increase in heat and darkening smoke and began working their way out of the area.

INJURIES

The three local government firefighters suffered first and second degree burns, and the five fire crew inmates suffered first and second degree burns. All personnel were released from various burn units by the following day.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMMEDIATE CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

- Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor, and adjoining forces
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.
- Wear all appropriate PPE while engaged in fire line assignments.

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
